## **Stats and Facts**

- the largest DS service provider in the West Region!
- ➤ 200 full time employees and 500 part time employees-- providing high quality supports and services.
- ➤ Wages and benefits represent over 80% of the total budget; administrative costs represent approximately 6%.
- ➤ 52 owned/7 leased properties and 62 owned vehicles
- Supports and services provided to over 650 people and their families. Supports provided include community participation (125 people), accommodation supports (240 people), family supports /respite options (326 people), and employment supports (113 people)
- ➤ In partnership with Regional Support Associates (clinical service provider), we provide **enhanced specialized services** to people with extraordinary challenges. With a solid reputation in delivering complex services we are sought after to mentor others across Ontario.

## **Some Accomplishments**

- ➤ Leadership towards others in the Developmental Service Sector -- we have presented to over 1,000 agency representatives at conferences and events. 25 agencies have connected with us to learn more about REAL Change and related work.
- > Because of REAL Change, we are the proud recipient of
  - the first OASIS Member Leadership Award (2017), and
  - the DSHR Strategy Agency Award (2017)
- ➤ Successful recipient of numerous grants. Of note, Ontario Trillium Funds are allowing us, together with the University of Windsor's HK Dept., to expand the APEX Exercise Program. The Local Poverty Reduction Fund provides evidence-based, valuable research into the impact of Career Compass. And Ontario 150 Grant Funds are enhancing the accessibility and safety of our Essex Centre.
- First Choice Employment (now Career Compass) finished a successful two year project with 113 new job opportunities, and 47 people obtaining meaningful employment. Career Compass will assist another DS organization in Ontario to implement Career Compass.

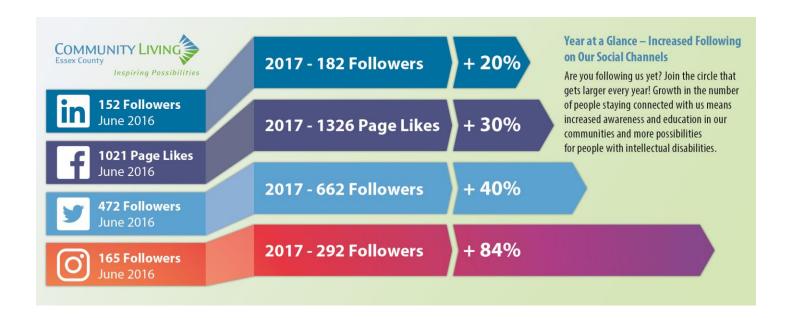
